# General Competition Rules

## 1. Eligibility

### As an Individual :

- a) Exhibitors must be a current tenant of a city of Birmingham Allotment or a partner of a current tenant or *tenant of a Sutton Coldfield site previously under the City of Birmingham Council*
- b) Young Gardener aged 15 to 18 years must be related to a current tenant of a city of Birmingham Allotment. *NOTE: A young gardener may enter senior classes he/she may be required to satisfy rule*

### Society/Association

Society or Association Exhibitor must represent a City of Birmingham Allotment Site/s  
A group of tenants may enter association class(s) only when their association declines to take part. Prize money will be paid by cheque.

## 2. Entries

- a) Copies of the schedule and entry forms will be supplied on request by the Show Secretary
- b) All entries must be made on the form provided.
- c) Each exhibitor must complete a separate entry form.
- d) Each exhibitor has only one entry per class.

Exhibitors must state on their entry form - ' site name, situation and plot number'

- e) All entry forms must be returned to the Show Secretary.
- f) Closing date for entries Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2023.
- g) Entry Cancellation -The Show Secretary is to be notified three days prior to the setup day of the show.

## 3. Entry Fee

- (a) Entry Fee to all classes – **FREE however voluntary donations are welcomed in order to support the future running of the show.**

## 4. Access

- a) Access to Show benches for exhibitors will be between 9.00 am and 8.00pm Friday 18th August 2023 and Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> August 2023 between 8.00 am and 8.45am.
- b) Show Bench Arena will be closed for judging from 9.00am until judging is complete.
- c) Only those persons officially appointed shall be present during the judging of exhibits
- d) No exhibit is to be removed before 5.00pm on Saturday 19th August 2023
- e) The Show Area will open to the public at approx. 12.00pm, closing to the public at 4.30pm.
- f) Presentation will be at 4.30pm on the day of the show.

## 5. Security

- a) The committee will make the most careful arrangement for the protection of all exhibits at the show.
- b) All exhibits, individual property etc., will be at the risk of the exhibitor and the committee will not be liable for the loss or damage due to any cause whatsoever.

## 6. Exhibits

- a) Exhibit class cards will be returned to the exhibitor by post as soon as possible after receipt of entry form.
- b) Failure to receive class cards - it is the exhibitor's responsibility to contact the Show Secretary should they not arrive in good time.
- c) Exhibitors wishing to retain their exhibits need to indicate with an "R" on their class card.

**7. Exhibitors will be responsible for**

- a) Cards are for correct class numbers.
- b) Placement on correct exhibit.
- c) Left face down

**8. Exhibit correctly named where stipulated.**

- a) All exhibits must be named for public information where possible.
- b) In classes where any variety is not known this will not disqualify the exhibitor.
- c) Judges will however recognise favourably a correctly named exhibit in awarding points.

**9. All individual exhibits must be grown on the exhibitor's allotment plot by the exhibitor.**

- a) All exhibits entered by an Association must be grown on that Association's site(s)
- b) All exhibits entered in children's classes need not be grown by the exhibitor.
- c) Exhibits must be cleaned and trimmed before delivery to show bench.
- d) All flowers must be exhibited in containers holding water. (vases, bowls, tubes etc.)
- e) Fruit exhibits to be displayed on paper plates, which will be supplied.

**10. Judging**

- a) All exhibits in allotment classes shall be Judged in accordance with the R.H.S "The Horticultural Show Handbook" (8th Edition 2016)
- b) Judges have the right to award additional prizes or withhold prizes in the event of insufficient entries in each class.
- c) Extra prizes will not exceed the lowest monetary sum of the class. With prizes of equal merit the prize money will be totalled and divided between equal merit winners.
- d) Any exhibit that does not conform to the schedule will be marked N.A.S. and disqualified.
- e) The decision of the judges will be final.
- f) In the event of a disqualification the lower prize winners will all be moved up one place and the lowest place will not be awarded.

**11. Prize Money.** Prize money will only be paid by cheque.

**12. Complaints**

- 1. The committee reserves the right to visit an allotment in the event of a dispute/complaint.
- 2. Any complaint regarding awards or exhibits must be made in writing to the show secretary no later than 2.00pm Saturday 19th August 2023.

Vegetables and Flowers must be displayed within the allocated area measuring 18inches x 24inches/450mm x 600mm.

Black cloth or tray painted black and Parsley for garnishing are permitted. Accessories e.g., plates, sand and rings are permitted.

The display must consist of **twelve kinds of vegetables and four kinds of fruit inside the box** With no restriction on the quantity of each of the twelve chosen vegetables and four chosen fruits. Quality, Staging/Overall Effect will be considered and marked in awarding prizes.

Each element will have a maximum of 25 points.

Vegetables	25 points
Fruit	25 points
Staging/Overall Effect	25 points

**Orientation** – viewed from Front (400mm), depth (600mm) across the show bench. Only Parsley for garnishing allowed.

A card identifying the variety of the fruit and vegetable is required on the display.

**Failure to identify produce will result in a one place penalty.**

Fruit boxes are readily available from any fruit retailer.

Boxes can be painted or covered for staging effect, these may be inclined a maximum of 75mm front to back.

Extensions or additions to box construction are not permitted.

Show bench allocation is 600mm x 600mm

A base board to mount the box is permitted and the outside of the box can be dressed for appearance only, the exhibit must **not exceed** the allocated space.

**Class A3** - Open to Allotments Societies and Associations who are eligible under rule 1d or 1e.

**Entry free**

No association identification is permitted on display until judging is completed.

No decoration is permitted.-Only the name of the Association may be added after judging has taken place.

**Points for class A3**, 1<sup>st</sup> = 6 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> = 4 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> = 2 points.

**Failure to identify produce will result in a one place penalty.**

**Class A4** - Open to Allotments Societies and Association who are eligible under rule 1d or 1e.

**Entry free**

No Association identification is permitted on display until judging is completed.

No decoration is permitted.

Only the name of the Association may be added after judging has taken place.

**Points for class A4** , 1<sup>st</sup> = 6 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> = 5 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> = 4 points.
